




History - The Ancient Greeks

ancient	Belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence.
invasion	Involving a country or region with an armed force.
AD	Anno Domini (number of years after the traditional date of Christ's birth)
BC	Before Christ (number of years before the traditional date of Christ's birth)
Greek	Relating to ancient Greece or its empire or people.
empire	an extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single leader
civilisation	The process by which a society or place reaches an advanced stage of social and cultural development and organisation.
city-state	A city that, with its surrounding territory, forms an independent state.
government	A group of people with the authority to govern a state.
democracy	A system of government by a whole population, typically through elected representatives.

<p>Describe some of the achievements that occurred during the Greek civilisation.</p> <p>Democracy was founded in Athens, famous plays were written, Hippocrates made advances in medicine, Parthenon and other temples built, advances in language and literature.</p>
<p>Who was Alexander the Great and why is he such an important historical figure?</p> <p>Alexander the Great came into power in 336 BC as King of the Ancient Greek Kingdom when he was just 20 years old and reigned for 13 years. He was known as one of the world's greatest military generals, he created a vast empire during his short time as King.</p>
<p>What was the outcome of the battle of the Trojan war?</p> <p>The war between Troy and Sparta lasted for 10 years but was eventually won by the Spartans when they tricked the Trojans into taking a gift inside their city walls—a Trojan Horse filled with Greek warriors.</p>
<p>Who were the Olympic games in honour of?</p> <p>The Olympic games were held in honour of the Greek God Zeus.</p>
